The transition planning process helps students with disabilities prepare for their transition to post-school living, learning and working. The direct connection between transition activities and the requirements for earning a CDOS Commencement Credential (a work-readiness certificate) which can be used to meet the requirements for one Regents exam will be highlighted.
